




Hotels

In Córdoba, you'll be welcomed by the refined charm of Crisol Jardines de Cordoba, a stylish, classic establishment that invites you to explore its beautiful gardens and outdoor spaces, which make it the perfect venue for hosting all kinds of events. Day 0 – Thursday, May 7 Depart home cities for Seville

Day 1 - Friday, May 8 Arrival in Seville • Welcome Dinner at Casa de la Judería

Welcome to Seville—the radiant heart of Andalusia, where Moorish palaces, flamenco rhythms, and orange-scented courtyards await you. Upon arrival, after clearing customs, we transfer to our charming accommodation, the Hotel Casa de la Judería for the first of three nights. This lovely hotel is nestled in the cobbled lanes of Seville's historic Jewish Quarter. This enchanting boutique hotel is a living mosaic of connected houses, patios, and gardens—an ideal introduction to the ambiance of Andalusia.

Take the afternoon to relax and soak in your surroundings. Perhaps sip a glass of wine beneath a vine-draped arch or simply enjoy the peaceful fountains and flowered courtyards.

This evening, we'll gather for a welcome dinner together—a warm introduction to the flavors of southern Spain, with local dishes crafted from fresh regional ingredients. Enjoy lively conversation and get to know your fellow travelers as we set the tone for the unforgettable days ahead.

Day 2 – Saturday, May 9 Old Seville Gardens and Parks

Today begins with a delightful walking tour through the winding alleyways and sunlit plazas of Seville's Old Quarter, one of the most beautiful and historic urban cores in Europe. Our first stop is the tranquil Jardines de Murillo, a leafy garden adorned with tiled benches, citrus trees, and monuments to Spanish writers—named after Seville's beloved Baroque painter, Bartolomé Esteban Murillo.

From here, we'll wander toward the crown jewel of Seville: the Real Alcázar, a stunning UNESCO World Heritage Site. Inside this Moorish-Christian palace, you'll explore royal halls, dreamy patios, and some of the most exquisite gardens in all of Spain. Think palm groves, hidden fountains, tiled pavilions, and the scent of orange blossom hanging in the air—a botanical and architectural paradise.

Next, we'll visit the majestic Seville Cathedral, the largest Gothic cathedral in the world, which stands on the site of a former mosque. Don't miss the Giralda Tower—originally a minaret—whose panoramic views of Seville reward those who climb to the top.

The afternoon is free to explore at your leisure. We recommend heading to the elegant Plaza de España, built for the 1929 Ibero-American Exposition, where tiled alcoves represent each province of Spain. Adjacent to the plaza lies the verdant expanse of Parque de María Luisa—a dreamlike public garden filled with sculptures, hidden groves, lily ponds, and shady walkways. It's a perfect spot for a peaceful stroll, a quiet bench break, or simply to admire the richness of Andalusian flora.

This evening is free to dine at your own pace. Night in Seville at Casa de la Judería. B, L



Day 3 - Sunday, May 10 Seville's Palaces and Setas de Sevilla

Seville's aristocratic past comes alive today with visits to two of the city's most elegant private palaces. Begin the morning at the Palacio de la Condesa de Lebrija, an architectural jewel filled with Roman mosaics, antique treasures, and intimate salons—all lovingly collected by the Countess of Lebrija, a pioneering intellectual and art collector. The tiled courtyards and frescoed rooms reflect centuries of Andalusian history.

Next, explore the Palacio de las Dueñas, a noble residence still owned by the House of Alba. Its romantic gardens, lemon trees, and quiet porticoes once inspired the poetry of Antonio Machado, who was born here. The palace is a graceful blend of Gothic, Renaissance, and Mudejar styles, with lush greenery softening its grand architecture.

After lunch, visit one of Seville's most modern and unexpected landmarks: the Setas de Sevilla (the "Mushrooms of Seville"), a stunning wooden structure that spans the Plaza de la Encarnación. Walk its panoramic skywalk for breathtaking views over Seville's rooftops—a contrast to the ancient courtyards and classical gardens we've explored.

The remainder of the day is at leisure. You might return to the gardens of Maria Luisa for a late afternoon stroll, or simply relax in one of the many hidden squares of the old town. Night in Seville at Casa de la Judería. B, L



Day 4 - Monday, May 11 Seville to the Palaces of Córdoba

This morning, we say farewell to Seville and travel through the heart of Andalusia toward Córdoba. En route, stop in the charming town of Palma del Río to visit the Palacio de Portocarrero—a little-known gem nestled behind fortress walls.

This private residence, still lived in today, features intimate Renaissance gardens filled with roses, fountains, and ivy-covered walls—truly one of Andalusia's best-kept secrets. Enjoy a delicious lunch in Palma del Río before continuing on to Córdoba, once the brilliant capital of Moorish Al-Andalus.

Upon arrival, step into the lush, labyrinthine world of the Palacio de Viana, a noble mansion famed for its twelve interlinked patios and gardens. From vibrant flower pots to delicate tiled fountains, every space bursts with color and life—an extraordinary preview of the Córdoba's world-renowned patio tradition.

After a day of touring we check into our hotel for the first of two nights. Night at Crisol Jardines de Cordoba. B, L, D



Day 5 – Tuesday, May 12 Exploring Córdoba

This morning, experience one of Spain's most awe-inspiring monuments: the Mezquita-Catedral of Córdoba. Step inside and be transported into a forest of red-and-white arches, marble columns, and spiritual grandeur—a rare architectural fusion of Moorish and Christian influences, and a powerful symbol of Córdoba's layered past.

From the Mezquita, continue into the Old Quarter, where narrow whitewashed lanes, irongrilled balconies, and splashes of bright flowers capture the soul of Andalusian charm. Soon after, you'll discover the city's most intimate treasures: the Patios de Córdoba. These private courtyards, hidden behind unassuming doors, burst into life with colorful geraniums, jasmine, and bougainvillea tumbling over ceramic pots. As you move from one patio to the next in the San Basilio district, you'll hear stories from the families who lovingly maintain them—a tradition recognized by UNESCO for its cultural significance. To enhance the experience, enjoy a brief tasting of Córdoba's local Montilla-Moriles wine, the perfect sip to accompany this celebration of beauty and hospitality.

End your day in the historic Jewish Quarter, where quiet streets, ancient synagogues, and artisan workshops create a timeless atmosphere. Perhaps enjoy an alfresco dinner this evening in one of the shaded patios you've come to admire.

We return to our hotel for dinner on your own. Night at Crisol Jardines de Cordoba. B, L




Day 6 - Wednesday, May 13

Córdoba to Granada's Alhambra and Generalife

After checkout we depart Córdoba and journey east toward the Sierra Nevada Mountains and the soul-stirring city of Granada.

This afternoon, visit the legendary Alhambra Palace, a marvel of Islamic architecture that seems to float above the city. Wander through arched halls, tranquil courtyards, and the jewel-like Generalife Gardens, once the summer retreat of the Nasrid kings. Roses, myrtles, and fountains echo with the whispers of centuries past. The gardens are designed not only for beauty, but for contemplation, cooling, and serenity—a masterclass in Moorish landscape design and the pinnacle of Andalusian garden artistry.

After our exciting day we check into our hotel for the first of two nights. Night at Catalonia Granada. B. L





Day 7 - Thursday, May 14

Exploring Granada

Begin your day in Granada's Albaicín quarter, the city's ancient Moorish heart. Meander through narrow cobblestone lanes to the famous Mirador de San Nicolás, where the view of the Alhambra against the snowy Sierra Nevada is considered the most iconic panorama in Spain.

Nearby, step inside the enchanting Carmen de los Geranios, once the residence of Belgian painter Max Moreau. This traditional Granada "carmen"—a walled house with a lush private garden—invites you into a serene world of shaded terraces, fountains, and bright geraniums spilling from ceramic pots. The intimate garden, with its tranquil views of the Alhambra, perfectly captures the essence of Granada's private horticultural treasures.

Descend via the atmospheric Paseo de los Tristes, a riverside promenade lined with cafés and overlooked by dramatic cliffs and cypress trees. Then, explore the Lower Sacromonte, a hillside district known for its cave homes and flamenco heritage.

In the afternoon, we visit the peaceful Federico García Lorca Gardens, a tribute to Spain's great poet and playwright. The gardens surround his former summer residence and offer a quiet retreat of olive trees, hedges, and open lawns—a modern oasis with a poetic soul.

The evening is free for you to explore Granada's culinary scene or simply relax under the stars. Dinner on your own. Night at Catalonia Granada. B. L



Day 8 - Friday, May 15

Granada to the Costa Tropical

This morning, we leave the snowy shadows of the Sierra Nevada behind and descend toward the Costa Tropical, a lush, fertile coastline where the Mediterranean sparkles and subtropical fruit trees flourish. Our first stop is a true hidden treasure: a visit to an ancient Roman olive mill museum, lovingly preserved and still in working order. Here, you'll witness the traditional methods of olive oil production passed down through millennia. Enjoy a tasting session of freshly pressed olive oils, each with its own complex aroma and flavor—liquid gold that has shaped Andalusia's cuisine and culture since antiquity.

Continue on to the enchanting village of Vélez de Benaudalla, nestled in the foothills of the mountains. Here, we'll explore the Nazari Garden, one of the finest surviving examples of Islamic garden design outside of the Alhambra. Peaceful pathways, trickling water features, and shaded terraces reflect the timeless beauty of Moorish landscape philosophy—where every element is designed for tranquility, reflection, and sensory delight.

After a morning of fragrant gardens and ancient traditions, we'll descend to the secluded cove of Cabria, near Almuñécar, for a relaxed and scenic late lunch surrounded by mango groves and avocado trees. This small bay is a tropical oasis, where sea breezes and citrus blossoms mingle in the air.

Later that afternoon, we check into our hotel to freshen up before we step into the heart of local tradition with a flamenco dinner show at Venta Luciano, nestled in Almuñécar's gypsy quarter. This intimate venue is renowned for hosting some of Spain's most acclaimed flamenco dancers and musicians—a raw, passionate performance where every clap, stomp, and note comes straight from the soul. Enjoy traditional cuisine in a rustic setting as the spirit of flamenco ignites the room. After the show we return to our hotel for the first of four nights. Night at Hotel Helios Almuñécar. Day 9 – Saturday, May 16 Tapas Trail in Almuñécar

Today offers a delightful blend of culture, nature, and cuisine in the heart of the Costa Tropical. We begin the day with a visit to the Almuñécar Tourism Office, where local guides will offer insights into the town's rich history—from its Roman salt factory and Phoenician heritage to its role in modern-day Andalusian culture.

Then, join a guided tapas trail, hopping between authentic local bars where each drink is accompanied by a traditional tapas. This is Andalusian life at its most relaxed and sociable —where flavors, friendships, and laughter come together effortlessly.

Midday, explore Parque El Majuelo, a botanical garden and cultural park nestled below the ancient Moorish castle. The park is home to an impressive collection of rare and exotic palm trees from around the world, set among Roman ruins and open-air sculptures. It's a peaceful, shaded escape just steps from the seafront.

The afternoon is yours to enjoy at leisure. Relax on the sun-kissed beaches, dip your toes into the turquoise waters of the Mediterranean, or stroll the seaside promenade lined with hibiscus, tamarind trees, and café terraces.

As the sun begins to set, enjoy a casual dinner at the hotel by the waves. Night at Hotel Helios Almuñécar. B, L, D



Day 10 - Sunday, May 17

Day Trip to Gibraltar

This morning, we set out for a unique cross-cultural experience with a day trip to Gibraltar, the famous British territory perched on the southern tip of Spain. As we arrive, take in the impressive Rock of Gibraltar, standing sentinel over the Strait where the Mediterranean meets the Atlantic.

Enjoy a visit to the Alameda Gibraltar Botanic Gardens, founded in 1816 and today home to over 500 species of plants from Gibraltar and around the world. Shaded pathways, historic stone structures, and views of the bay make this a tranquil and exotic oasis at the edge of Europe.

Nearby, we'll also stroll through the Governor's Garden, a refined green space adjoining the colonial-era Government House. With its grand palm trees, Mediterranean blooms, and peaceful ambiance, it's a charming window into Gibraltar's botanical identity. We return to Almuñécar in the late afternoon with time to relax before dinner.

Day 11 - Monday, May 18 Day Trip to Málaga

Today we travel along the sparkling coast to the city of Málaga, a dynamic blend of historic charm and contemporary creativity. Begin with a visit to the Museo Picasso Málaga, located in the elegant Buenavista Palace. This exceptional museum holds an intimate collection of works by Pablo Picasso, who was born in Málaga in 1881. From early sketches to abstract canvases, it offers insight into the genius of one of the world's greatest artists.

Afterward, enjoy a guided stroll through the Pedro Luis Alonso Gardens, a delicate display of Andalusian and French landscaping featuring rose gardens, citrus trees, and colorful seasonal plantings arranged around quiet fountains and pathways.

Nearby, the Jardines de Málaga, just beneath the Alcazaba fortress, offer yet another oasis in the city. With palm-lined promenades, exotic flora, and sea breezes rustling the leaves, it's the perfect place to pause and reflect on your garden-filled journey through Andalusia.

The afternoon is yours to explore. Perhaps visit the Roman Theatre, relax at a beach café, or take a short funicular ride for panoramic views over the Costa del Sol. In the evening, enjoy a delightful farewell dinner in Almunecar. Night at Hotel Helios Almuñécar. B, L, D


Day 2 - Wednesday, May 20 Gaudi's Masterpieces and The Heights of Montjuic

After our included breakfast, our day begins with a journey into the imaginative world of Antoni Gaudi at Park Guell, a whimsical garden-city filled with kaleidoscopic mosaics, serpentine benches, and playful architectural forms. This UNESCO World Heritage Site offers not only Gaudi's genius at every turn but also sweeping views across the city to the shimmering Mediterranean Sea.

Next, we'll stand in awe before the Sagredo Familia, Gaudi's still-unfinished basilica and perhaps the most extraordinary church in the world. Its soaring spires and intricate facades tell biblical stories in stone and glass, creating a breathtaking testament to faith and artistry that has been over a century in the making.

In the afternoon, we'll make our way to Montjuic Hill, where history, culture, and nature converge. Day 3 – Thursday, May 21 Exploring Barcelona

Or perhaps you'd prefer to spend the day at Barceloneta Beach, soaking in the Mediterranean sun with a seafood lunch by the water. For a more bohemian experience, the Gracia district offers tree-shaded plazas, vibrant street art, and an authentic neighborhood charm.

For those who wish to venture outside the city, we offer an optional excursion to Montserrat (separate registration required), a dramatic mountain range just on hour's drive from Barcelona. Here, jagged limestone peaks rise high above Catalonia, creating one of Spain's most iconic landscapes. We'll visit the Benedictine Monastery of Santa Maria de Montserrat, home to the revered Black Madonna statue, a symbol of Catalan devotion. If we're lucky, we may hear the angelic voices of the Montserrat Boys' Choir performing in the basilica. There is time to explore the museum, sample local liqueurs, or ride the funicular for sweeping views of the countryside.
